

Top things to do in Maui:

1. Road to Hana- The Road to Hana is more than just a great drive through a beautiful area of Maui. Most visitors tend to zip to and from Hana with a checklist of sights to photograph. It will be an 8-hour drive back and forth from Lahaina.

2. Haleakala National Park- This special place vibrates with stories of ancient and modern Hawaiian culture and protects the bond between the land and its people. The park also cares for endangered species, some of which exist nowhere else. Come visit this special place - renew your spirit amid stark volcanic landscapes and sub-tropical rain forest with an unforgettable hike through the backcountry.  3. 'Iao Valley- 'Iao Valley State Monument is the place to be if you like the tropical flora of Hawaii. Take a walk on the 'Iao Needle Lookout Trail and Ethnobotanical Loop learn about the plants that Hawaiians brought.

5. Exploring Kihei- Kihei is beach-combing territory on Maui's southwest shore, the sunniest, driest end of the island. Once a regular destination for sojourning Hawaiian royalty, Kihei features 6 miles of beaches offering clear views of Kahoolawe, Molokini, Lanai and West Maui. Along with swimming and surfing, you can also find great snorkeling and kayaking and you may even spot a giant humpback whale spouting or breaching the ocean's surface.
